We joined this project with the aim of contributing to initiatives that have the potential to develop the overall quality and effectiveness of youth work, particularly in the areas of environmental sustainability and social innovation. We consider educating youth about sustainable fashion practices and the impact of fast fashion to be one of the most crucial responsibilities of youth organizations in order to foster responsible global citizens.
